

# CROCKERTON CHURCH OF ENGLAND VA PRIMARY SCHOOL

## Pupil Premium Grant 2014-2015



This report describes income and expenditure for the Pupil Premium Grant and contains information about the attainment of eligible children compared with others.

### Reporting Period

Information in this report refers to the school year 2014-2015 (September 2014 – August 2015). The impact of spending during this period is shown in pupil attainment data from summer 2015.

### Income

In 2014-2015 the school received funding for 5 children who were, or had been, eligible for free school meals and 8 children from Service families. Crockerton School received a total of £9000 for the 2014-2015 financial year and will receive £9600 for the 2015-2016 financial year. Proportionate distribution of these funds gives an income of £9350 for the reporting period.

### Expenditure

Listed below are the things that we provided because of the Pupil Premium Grant.

'One-to-one' and small group teaching of literacy (part-time TA- 'Sound Discovery')	£2250
'One-to-one' and small group teaching of maths (part-time TA – 'Back on Track')	£2250
Subject leadership time for English and maths: development and interventions	£990
Miscellaneous resources and activities	£500

### Measuring Impact

#### 2015 Key Stage 2 Results

The table shows the proportion of children in two groups reaching or exceeding the expected level of attainment (Level 4+):

Children reaching or exceeding the expected level (KS2 2015)

	Reading	Writing	Maths
<b>Eligible for PPG (2 Children)</b>	100%	50%	100%
<b>Others (8 children)</b>	100%	75%	100%
<b>National (all children 2014)</b>	89%	85%	86%

As well as attainment another important measure is the progress made by each child. All children eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant made expected progress (+2 levels) from KS1 to KS2 in reading, writing and maths.

## 2015 Key Stage 1 Results

All children in the class, regardless of whether or not they were eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant, reached or exceeded the expected level of attainment (Level 2+):
